2021 RUMC (RCSI & UCD Malaysian Campus) Conferring Ceremony


113 graduates were conferred with undergraduate Bachelor of Medicine, Surgery and Obstetrics degrees from the RUMC on Sun 30th May at a virtual


GT Programmes Update



Dr Catherine Moran, Class of 2006

Dr Moran was appointed as Consultant Neurosurgeon to Beaumont Hospital in Oct 2020 and is notably the first female neurosurgeon appointee in Ireland. Dr Moran's sub-specialisation is functional neurosurgery so in this role she will carry out deep brain stimulation, implanting electrodes in the deep nucleus of the brain, which send a current to disturb the abnormal motor circuits so that the patient's normal movement is restored. Dr Moran's appointment was officially announced to celebrate International Women's Day 2021 on Mon 8th March.



Dr Martin Tobin, Class of 1975

Dr Tobin, an Illinois-based Critical Care Physician, Pulmonologist & Academic is a world recognised expert in acute respiratory failure & mechanical ventilation. Global press coverage reported that Dr Tobin gave clear testimony & crucial evidence at the Derek Chauvin Trial on Wed 21st April for the murder of George Floyd.



Dr Linda Mulligan, Class of 2002

Dr Mulligan, Consultant Forensic Pathologist, with 18+ years' experience, both nationally and internationally, in forensic pathology, histopathology and clinical medicine was appointed as State Pathologist in Feb 2021.

EDI (Equality, Diversity & Inclusion) Staff Survey

The School's EDI Committee conducted a survey of staff in March 2021. The survey explored issues under SEVEN THEMES relating to gender inclusion in the School and informs us on initiatives we can implement, initiatives to support staff and ensure that the School is a place where all staff have equal access to opportunity. 25% of staff (55% faculty and 45% non-faculty) responded to the survey. 65% of respondents were female and 35% male. RIP - Mr Enda McDermott (UCD School of Medicine, Class of 1977) Tues 4th May

With great sadness, our Dean, Prof Michael Keane, advised staff across the School of the unexpected death of Mr Enda McDermott. Enda was Consultant Breast, Endocrine and General Surgeon at St Vincent's University Hospital and Associate Professor of Surgery at UCD. Colleagues across St Vincent's remember the special bond that they had with Enda because of his very kind and respectful nature. They also remember Enda as a trusted and highly valued colleague, who was always calm under pressure and loyal to his patients and colleagues to the end. In their tributes, close colleagues in St Vincent's Breast and Endocrine Unit have spoken of Enda as a gifted and exemplary surgeon and as a terrific educator and mentor, to all young medics around him and Enda was also remembered for promoting mentorship in surgery as a way of life. He will be especially fondly remembered by generations of UCD medical students as an outstanding teacher and role model, always generous with his time. All express what an absolute privilege it was to have known and worked this gentleman and surgeon.
