1. Progression to the Year Abroad

International modern languages students must pass (minimum D-) ALL language modules in their 2 main languages at level 2 in order to take up their ERASMUS place, irrespective of which country they are going to.

2. Application process

a.) Attend information sessions organised by the language sections with whom you may want to go abroad. <u>Please keep an eye on your email messages for announcements about times/venues for these meetings.</u>

b.) Do some research on the host institutions you are thinking of attending - online and also by contacting final year students. Please email paolo.acquaviva@ucd.ie **or** strumper.krobb@ucd.ie if you wish to contact a particular student.

c.) Complete the BA International Modern Languages application form (attached) and return to the Dr Sabine Krobb (<u>strumper.krobb@ucd.ie</u>) by <u>Monday, 23 November, 5.pm</u>. Your application form will be passed on to the relevant Erasmus coordinator(s). Please DO NOT fill in any other application form except if you are explicitly asked by the relevant subject Erasmus coordinator.

Please note that you will also have to apply centrally on the UCD system for your place. Do NOT apply before submitting your application to us, and do not apply for a place other than the one we are allocating to you.

3. Academic requirements while abroad

You will spend the Year Abroad at a third level institution in a country where one of your target languages is spoken.

You must complete coursework and credits at the host university abroad: these do not count for your GPA but in order to qualify for an international degree you must satisfy the requirements set by the language subject coordinating your stay. Failure to fulfil the requirements abroad will result in you failing the year abroad element and will mean that you cannot be awarded an international degree and will have to transfer into the Arts programme.

While abroad you will be expected to:

keep in contact with your UCD Erasmus Coordinator regarding module choice and coursework. It is imperative that you notify the Erasmus Coordinator immediately if you experience any difficulties with this.

- attend classes and complete assessments relating to the host country (detailed requirements and recommendations are supplied by each language subject). You may be required to show that you have regularly attended and participated in classes, so wherever possible please keep records relating to this.
- Complete a minimum of 45 ECTS credits in total Of these a minimum 30 credits should be in modules relating to the language/culture/history etc. of the host country.
 A minimum of 10 credits should relate to the <u>other</u> language. The remaining credits may be chosen freely.
 All module choices are, of course, subject to approval by the Erasmus Coordinator.

It may be advisable to sign up for a couple of additional modules, in case something does not go to plan. Be guided by the subject Erasmus coordinator.

• Please note that it does **not** normally suffice to attend language modules only even if they amount to the required number of credits.
